Political scientist to speak at LHU

Kimberly S. Adams, associate professor of political science at East Stroudsburg University and the owner of Adams Political Research & Consulting, will visit Lock Haven University on Feb. 23.

Adams will give a talk entitled, "Women and Politics: Shattering the Glass Ceiling, One Vote at a Time." As a longtime scholar and political activist, Adams possesses a

breadth of knowledge concerning the American political system, especially in relation to

non-traditional legislators, such as women and African Americans.

Recently, Adams has completed a series of lectures at the University of Rijeka in Croatia covering topics such as the 1965 Voting Rights Act, the changing American electorate for women and racial minorities, and immigration.

Adams will present at 6:30 pm on Tuesday, Feb. 23 in the Hamblin Hall of Flags.
